Annual President's Report, July 2023

The last fiscal year has been filled with growth for PLATO. Membership continues to recover from the losses that we suffered in 2020-2021. For most of us, the scepter of Covid no longer hangs over us, but some still seek to really recover a greater sense of normalcy. PLATO members are again able to attend lectures, travel to plays and concerts facilitated by the Special Events Committee, and to participate in courses organized by the Curriculum Committee, which are available in a variety of formats such as in-person, virtual, or hybrid. We've learned the convenience, as well as the limitations of "virtual" events. In June we held an Annual Meeting for our membership, for the first time since 2019. About 100 attendees enjoyed fellowship, refreshments, and a presentation by Dr. Amy L. Rosebrough, Interim State Archeologist, on the "discovery, recovery, and preservation of the Lake Mendota cances".

The Agora, Volume 8, will be published this fall with another fine assortment of fiction, nonfiction, poetry, and visual arts from members of PLATO. Almost 80 submissions were received, and *The Agora* board juries honed them down into a wonderful volume to share creative literary and artistic talents for members to enjoy. The high-quality, glossy magazine will be mailed to members in the fall, offering the eighth installment of this well-loved biennial publication. *The Agora* board welcomed three new members to its fold this year, adding to a group already dedicated to maintaining the quality of this journal.

FY 2022/23 was extremely successful for the Fund Development Committee, through the very generous donations from our PLATO members. Eighty-seven members donated \$34,012, a record amount. This made it possible to disperse \$46,000 to UW and community agencies, also a record amount. All of our donations are used to support programs that provide educational opportunities for low-income/marginalized persons in our community. Hopefully, we will be able to do even better this next year.

We were deeply saddened by the death of Louise Fowler in early 2023. She was well known to many at PLATO as the voice on the phone at our desk in the UW-DCS offices. She had postponed full retirement in order to help us as the administrative support from UW-DCS diminished. We really came to appreciate her many talents, and the amount of detail needed to run the office, and help the committees carry out their functions. In the months after Covid hit us, she helped with the transition that brought Stephanie Steigerwaldt into the PLATO office. While she did transfer a lot of her institutional knowledge, sadly we can no longer drop her an email with our latest question.
