



2022-2023 Education Fund Scholarships

The PLATO Education Fund currently provides scholarship assistance to four University of Wisconsin-Madison returning adult students, financial support for the Odyssey Project, and educational opportunities for young people through four community organizations. This is all made possible by the generosity of PLATO members who value lifelong learning and see value in providing much-needed financial support to people who might otherwise be unable to take advantage of educational opportunities due to financial need.

Returning Adult Student Program

Administered through the UW-Madison Division of Continuing Studies, these scholarships are awarded on a competitive basis and targeted toward single-parent students and other nontraditional adult returnees.

Financial need and academic potential are critical components in determining the awards.

The PLATO Education Fund awarded four \$3,500 scholarships for the 2022-2023 academic year.

Odyssey Project

For the fiscal year of July 2022 – June 2023, the PLATO Education Fund awarded \$6,000 in support of the **Odyssey Project**. Since 2003, the Odyssey Project (odyssey.wisc.edu) has empowered more than 500 adults living near the poverty level to find their voices and get a jump-start on college degrees they never thought possible. Their children participate in **Odyssey Junior**, allowing whole families to learn and grow to work toward a better future. **Onward Odyssey** connects program alumni with other UW-Madison courses, including Special Education Paraprofessional training, Food Systems, and African American Studies.

PLATO Education Fund Supports Community Organizations

The PLATO Education Fund is supporting four community agencies that offer a broad range of educational opportunities for low income, marginalized adults, and youth. Each organization is receiving a \$5,000 grant.
